The Loose Park Garden Center was built in 1957 for meetings and horticultural exhibitions of various kinds. The garden center, located in Loose Park, has two large meeting rooms with small kitchens attached, horticultural library, and a Japanese Tea Room.

Tuesday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

### Meeting room rental fees

Horticulture groups (2 hours): \$25  
Non-horticulture groups (2 hours): \$50  
An additional \$30 per hour overtime fee will be charged for time after 5 p.m.

Loose Park is one of Kansas City's most beautiful parks. The 74-acre park was given to the city in 1929 by Ella Loose to honor her husband Jacob, a businessman and philanthropist. Located south of the Country Club Plaza, Loose Park provides elegance, exercise and history.

The elegance of the park stems from the famous Laura Conyers Smith Municipal Rose Garden (built in 1939) and the classical walkway that leads to it. As spring arrives, more than 4,000 roses -- in 125 varieties -- burst to life in the circular garden courtyard. Fountains, statues, large verandas and pathways make this one of the most romantic spots in the city. The rose garden is a popular place for weddings and receptions. Southeast of the rose garden, a pond sits at the edge of the park. Benches, bridges and small nooks allow for a restful stop.


Exercise is easy to find, with a jogging and walking path encircling the entire park. Tennis courts can be found west of the rose garden. The gently rolling hills that make up the large grassy middle are perfect for flying kites, playing catch, walking the dog or just relaxing under a tree.

There's also history lessons at Loose Park. Markers along the southern edge of the park describe the Battle of Westport, part of which was fought near these grounds.

The Stanley R. McLane Arboretum, in Loose Park, was founded in 1972 by Stanley R. McLane the landscape supervisor for J.C. Nichols Company. The arboretum has over 4,000 trees with new additions being added yearly. We currently have 4 tree walks with maps and labels identifying trees. The Maps are available at the Garden Center.
