Resolution #31640 – Facility Use and Concession Agreement with Kansas City Diversity Coalition

On a motion by Commission Wagner, duly seconded the Board approved the Agreement with Kansas City Diversity Coalition and authorized the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: Kansas City Pride Community Alliance is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Their board members are a group of distinguished and diverse community leaders who provide guidance, knowledge, and key fundraising support to help build and strengthen the LGBTQ community.

Kansas City Pride Community Alliance wishes to enter into a Facility Use with Concession Agreement for the use of Theis Park, located at Oak and 47th Street, to hold Show Me KC Pride Festival on August 20-23, 2021. Their Show me KC Pride festival will feature a main stage with national as well as local acts, vendors, food trucks and family activities.

Resolution #31652 – Agreement with Kansas City Irish Fest

On a motion by Commissioner Wagner, duly seconded, the Board approved the Agreement with Kansas City Irish Fest and authorized the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: The Kansas City Irish Fest is dedicated to promoting the culture, music, and history of Ireland and of the Irish people who call Kansas City home. Kansas City Irish Fest offers attendees the chance to see some of the top Irish entertainment in the world. Their mission is to graciously provide our local and regional community with the best, friendliest and most enjoyable Irish cultural weekend by creating and presenting the best blend of music, education, and great craic.

Kansas City Irish Fest wishes to enter into a Facility Use with Concession Agreement for the use of Washington Square Park, located at 100 E. Pershing Rd, to hold the Irish Festival on September 3, 2021, through September 5, 2021. The festival will include Irish culture vendors, food,

beverages, as well as alcohol vendors. There will also be activities using Irish themes and traditions.

Kansas City Parks and Recreation will be compensated \$12,000 for this three-day event. In addition, KC Park Ambassador will be assisting with the coffee bar and will be given a donation from the tips to apply towards their funding needs. Set-up will begin on August 31, 2021, at 8am and tear down will end on September 7, 2021, at 10pm. KCPD, KCFD, FBI, and KC Medical will be on hand for this event.

Resolution #31653 – Acceptance of the Health Forward Grant – Artemis Project

On a motion by Commissioner Mecklenburg, duly seconded, the Board approved and accepted of the Health Forward Foundation Grant in the amount of \$125,000 for the “Artemis” project.

Background: KC Parks proposes “Project Artemis”, initiative to improve access to our parks system and its programs for people with disabilities. This project is named for a young Kansas Citian with a disability who loves the parks system yet struggles to access its amenities. This initiative will create policy changes to improve inclusion for people with disabilities, a plan to improve physical features of the parks in the LifeX zip codes for people with disabilities, a plan to improve access to programming that integrates people with disabilities into existing programming, and outreach that will promote park use and physical activity among people with disabilities. KC Parks requested \$151,000 for this project and has been awarded \$125,000.

Planning: A consultant will be hired to evaluate the accessibility and inclusion of the KC Parks System and its programs for people with physical disabilities. The consultant will identify environmental, educational and policy changes needed to increase accessibility and create a plan to address those changes.

Physical Improvements: Physical improvements to the parks will be made based on the recommendation of the consultant. This work is already underway with existing recommendations, though the consultant will help focus our efforts on the highest priorities.

Programming: Existing physical activity programming will be evaluated and adjusted to be inclusive to people with disabilities.

Training: KC Parks will train its recreation staff in how to modify programming to support people with disabilities.

Policy Changes: KC Parks staff will work with city administrators to develop a full inclusion

policy with actionable items to implement across the entire KC Parks system. As an example, a policy may include requiring retrofitting all playground surfaces to be ADA compliant.

Resolution #31654 – Acceptance of the Health Forward Grant – Virtual Learning

On a motion by Commissioner Mecklenburg, duly seconded, the Board approved and the accepted the Health Forward Foundation Grant in the amount of \$50,000 to help pay for virtual learning sites.

Background: The Kansas City, Missouri Parks and Recreation Department offered free virtual learning sites to Kansas City Public School Students during the pandemic in the spring of 2021. The Health Forward Foundation grant in the amount of \$50,000 will help pay for staff salaries and operational costs, related to the virtual learning sites at Gregg/Klice, Brush Creek, Southeast and Garrison Community Centers.

Resolution #31655 – Facility Use with Concessions Agreement with Planet Hockey, Inc.

On a motion by Commissioner Goode, duly seconded, the Board approved the Facility Use with Concessions Agreement with Planet Hockey, Inc. and authorized the Director or designee to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: Planet Hockey Inc. is a twenty-four-year-old national organization that provides hockey camps for youth of all ages. Planet Hockey provides clinics throughout the United States and Europe and have partnered with Line Creek Community Center the last few years.

Planet Hockey will be offering a 5-day Super Skills Camp at Line Creek Community Center from July 19 thru July 23, 2021. The camp will run from 8:30a-2:30p each day and the facility will remain open to the public.

Planet Hockey will compensate the city \$3,850.00 for the use of the facility. This agreement runs from July 19, 2021 – July 23, 2021.

Resolution #31656 – Facility Use with Concessions Agreement with Kansas City Curling Club

On a motion by Commissioner Goode, duly seconded, the Board approved the Facility Use with Concessions Agreement with Kansas City Curling Club and authorized the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: The Kansas City Curling Club is requesting the use of Line Creek Community Center for the limited purpose of conducting a bonspiel; a tournament that consists of several games held on a weekend.

The Kansas City Curling Club will compensate the City \$9,255.00 during term of this agreement. Beer will be served and no charge to all persons of legal age. Line Creek Community Center and The Kansas City Curling Club will work together to provide security.

The terms of this agreement will start on July 30, 2021, and will end no later than August 1, 2021

Public Hearing:

Star Palmer came before the Board to ask the Board to deny a permit to the Kansas City Diversity Coalition for the use of Ilus Davis Park.

Ms. Ellington, E J Livingston, Hunter Pace, Natasha, and others came before the Board to ask Board assistance in finding a Parks and Recreation facility to use for the GYRL program. Ms. Ellington commented that are using the Mohart Center, however, if there is an event planned, they are displaced and is needing a more stable location. Ms. Ellington commented that there are no funds to be used for rental.

Otis Reliford came before the Board. Mr. Reliford handed out a letter to the Board asking that a Black man or women be placed in the vacant Parks and Recreation Directors position.

Background

The Kansas City, Missouri Parks and Recreation Department and JE Dunn Construction have identified a mutually beneficial plan to build a shelter at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Square Park, located at 1900 Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. JE Dunn will be working with their architects and journeymen for this project. This shelter is located near the tennis courts and is valued at \$170,000. Naming rights will need to adhere to the naming and renaming policy the Parks Board. The policy states that a facility may be named within a park when there has been a substantial donation made for the construction of the facility

This agreement will allow for the Park Board and JE Dunn Construction to cooperate to plan and build a shelter at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Square Park. The Shelter project will include plans and construction of the shelter, with park benches near the existing tennis courts. Once completed, the shelter will be sole property and responsibility of KC Parks to maintain and operate.

This donation agreement will allow JE Dunn to facilitate planning and construction of a shelter. The term of this agreement is one year from the execution of the agreement.

Recommendation

Staff recommends Board approval of the Agreement with JE Dunn Construction and request authorization for the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board and accept the shelter as a gift from JE Dunn Construction.

SUBJECT: Sunderland Foundation Grant for Parking Lot at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Square Park

BACKGROUND:

The Sunderland Foundation has awarded the Kansas City, Missouri Parks and Recreation Department a grant in the amount of \$467,000 to help pay for the improvements to the parking lot at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Square Park. The total estimated cost of the parking lot is \$817,000. Matching funds of \$300,000 was committed from the Public Improvements Advisory Committee, in the amount of \$100,000 each. The accounts are District 3 (# 3090-708309-611060-70204927); District 4 (#3090-708409-611060-70204927) and District 6 (#3090-708609-611060-70204927). An additional \$50,000 from the Developer Allotment Account 6490-702800-S200A will be used towards this project. The parking lot will not be built until 2022.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Board acceptance of the Southerland Foundation Grant in the amount of \$467,000 and request Board authorization for the Director or designee to forward Resolution to City Council, requesting Council to designate the Director or designee as requisitioning authority to expend the sum of \$467,000 from funds heretofore be appropriated to the account.

Subject: Amendment #4 for EAB Ash Tree Treatment FY20 contract with Shawnee Mission Tree Service DBA Arbor Masters Tree & Landscape.

BACKGROUND AND DESCRIPTION:

On July 10, 2019, the city entered into an Agreement with Arbor Masters Tree & Landscape in the amount of \$150,000 for EAB Ash Tree Treatment of an estimated 1,875 of Ash trees on public property for the control of Emerald Ash Borer.

Amendment# 1, extended the contract time to May 31, 2020, and Amendment #2, in the amount of \$150,000 provided for additional services to treat 1,875 Ash trees, bringing the total contract amount to \$ 300,000.00 and extended the contract time to May 31, 2021. Amendment #3 extended the contract time to May 31, 2022.

This Amendment #4 will provide additional fiscal year 2022 funds for ash tree treatment services in the amount of \$83,403.00 to treat an estimated 1,042 ash trees, and for a total contract amount of \$383,403.00. Funding is available in account #3090-707771. The contract was exempted from MBE/WBE goals.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Board approval of Amendment #4 with Arbor Masters Tree & Landscape in the amount of \$83,403.00 and requests Board authorization for the Director or designee to execute the amendment on behalf of the Board.

SUBJECT: License Agreement - LiveBarn, Inc.

BACKGROUND:

LiveBarn is an industry-leading service for youth and amateur sports live streaming. They provide and install high-definition cameras that allow the users to experience their youngster's games from the comfort of their own homes. This is an OnDemand service that providing the ability watch games all over the country from over 2,000 venues and 5,000 active live streams throughout the US and Canada. Games can be viewed either in real-time or for up to thirty days after the event has taken place.

This agreement with LiveBarn, Inc, will broadcast youth hockey games from Line Creek Community Center with an option to expand to the athletic fields if the service is proven popular. LiveBarn will install and maintain all hardware, software, and internet bandwidth and will also provide customer service.

This service is provided on a subscription basis. The Parks and Recreation Department Line Creek will receive 30% of all subscriptions sold with an estimated revenue of ranging between \$250.00 - \$1,000.00/month. The terms of this agreement are from August 1, 2021 – April 30, 2026 with an option to renew by mutual agreement of both parties.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Board approval of this license agreement with LiveBarn and requests Board authorization for the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.
