They will compensate City \$75.00/hour of usage for a total estimated payment of \$5,700.00. The terms of this agreement will begin July 30, 2023 and end April 28, 2024. New Solid Rock Community Church will provide insurance per City's requirements.

Resolution #32294 - Amendment 2 to the Professional Services Contract with ArtsTech

On a motion by Commissioner Smith, duly seconded by Commissioner Perez-Rico, the Board approved the Agreement with Arts Tech to extend the contract time to August 31, 20224 and authorized the Director or designee to execute the amendment on behalf of the Board.

Background: On November 15, 2022 the Parks Board of Commissioners, through resolution #32046, approved a contract with ArtsTech for the use of the facilities at Westport Roanoke and Kansas City North Community Centers. During the terms of this agreement ArtsTech will offer youth and adult feebased arts classes. The original terms of the agreement began on November 16, 2022 and would end on April 30, 2023.

On February 7, 2023 the Parks Board of Commissioners, through resolution #32126, approved Amendment #1 extending the end date to August 31, 2023. This Amendment will extend the end date to April 30, 2024. All other terms stated in the original contract remain the same.

Resolution #32295 - Encroachment License Agreement with 1612 Grand LLC

On a motion by Commissioner Smith, duly seconded by Commissioner Perez-Rico, the Board approved the Encroachment License Agreement with 1612 Grand LLC and authorized the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: The Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners is being requested to enter into an Encroachment License agreement with 1612 Grand LLC, a Limited liability Company (Licensee) of the property located at 1612 Grand Boulevard, for non-exclusive permission to enter upon the twelve & one third square feet of the Premises adjacent to the building for the limited purpose of maintaining a blade sign fixture to be installed for Licensee's business during the term of the agreement, all together having a total combined projection of 12.33 SF and calculated at a rate of \$18 per SF, for use of the Boulevard right-of-way. This agreement defines both license and maintenance terms for the use of Parks & Recreation Department jurisdictional right-of-way adjacent to the subject property along the eastern building face, also known as Grand Blvd.

The licensee will be responsible for complying with all the terms set forth in the agreement such as maintaining a certificate of insurance for use of the area, keeping it in a clean and safe condition in exchange for annual compensation not to exceed \$221.94. Furthermore, the agreement defines the conditions by which modifications and cancellations may occur.

Resolution #32296 - Amendment #1 with Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation - Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Cultural Corridor within Brush Creek Project

On a motion by Commissioner Smith, duly seconded by Commissioner Perez-Rico, the Board approved Amendment #1 to the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation Grant Scope and Term to April 30, 2024.

Background: The Brush Creek Corridor in Kansas City MO extends from the state line to the confluence of the Blue River. The corridor is diverse in businesses, schools, churches, neighborhoods, parks, income levels and has great potential for to become a destination cultural corridor. The City renamed the road to

Dr Martin Luther King Jr Boulevard and has made recent improvements to the DR MLK JR Park with the addition a playground, trail, restroom and shelter.

The Parks and Recreation Department applied for funding from the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation Grant Award for Dr Martin Luther King Jr Cultural Corridor within the Brush Creek Area and receive notice of award in the amount of \$1,000,000. The project area is defined by Dr MLK JR Boulevard for south limits; Emanual Cleaver II Boulevard for the north limits, Cleveland Ave. for the east limits; and the Paseo Boulevard for the south limits.

On November 29, 2021, the Park Board approved the agreement for projects scope that includes community engagement, conceptual design, survey, geotechnical work, final design, call for artist, art design and fabrication of art exhibits. This agreement will require City Council approval because the estimation of revenue for the \$1,000,000 Kauffman grant.

Amendment #1 is for amending the term of the grant and scope of the grant amended for the end date of the grant to April 30, 2024. Task items completion dates tied to amendment are listed below.

- September 15, 2023, \$500,000.00 Contingent (Progress Report due on September 1,2023)
- September 1, 2023, Progress Report
- May 3, 2024, Final Report

Resolution #32285 - Ground Water Monitoring Well Maintenance and Sampling Agreement with Greenfield Environmental Multistate Trust LLC

On a motion by Commissioner Smith, duly seconded by Commissioner Perez-Rico, the Board approved the Agreement with Greenfield Environmental Multistate Trust LLC and authorized the Director or designee to execute the agreement on behalf of the Board.

Background: The Board of Kansas City, Missouri Parks and Recreation Commissioners, is being requested to enter into an Agreement for Ground Water Monitoring Well Maintenance and Sampling, for Licensee to perform among other things, the activities permitted herein.

Whereas the Licensee is responsible for, among other things, owning the former Tronox/Kerr-McGee Wood Treating Facility located in Kansas City, MO (and across the Blue River from Blue Valley Park) and managing environmental activities at and around the facility with support from the Licensee, subject to available funding in a budget approved by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, the facility's lead regulatory agency; and whereas Licensee desires to use, on behalf of Multistate Trust and at the pleasure of the Board, certain Park land and/or Boulevard property located at Blue Valley Park 2301 Topping Ave Kansas City, MO 64129, and in consideration of the payments and mutual agreements contained within this Agreement, the City, Multistate Trust and Licensee agree to permissions, terms and notification requirements within. The annual fee to be paid the Licensee to the City shall be \$2,160.00. The Agreement further defines terms by which the parties, upon completion, the Agreement shall end unless it is renegotiated and renewed in the future.

BACKGROUND:

On June 25, 2015, The Parks and Recreation Department entered into an agreement with Go Ape Treetop Adventures to construct and operate a Treetop Challenge Course in Swope Park. The facility was a welcome and popular addition to the list of amenities the park offers. Since then, an Ax -Throwing feature and a TreeTop Junior course have been added.

Last year "Nights and Heights" was added during the Halloween season, this is a shortened experience on the Treetop Adventure course at night while it is illuminated.

Go Ape is planning to add a new offering called "Haunted Trails" this Halloween season.

Haunted Trails would be an elevation of the Frights at Height experience. Go Ape proposes to undertake decorating the course and course grounds with a higher level of Halloween décor to create an add-on or stand-alone offering which involves a walk through the haunted woods "Haunted Trails," thereby creating a premier haunted attraction. Pricing for Haunted Trails would be \$14.95.

Background

The Indian Creek Trail, The Trolley Trail and Blue River Trails are trail segments within the Metro system that connect parks and communities in the Kansas City MO area. There is a missing link between these three trails from E.95th St and the Blue River to Prospect and 85th St. The portion of this section between E.95th and the Blue River to Prospect to Blue River is funded and ready to bid.

On January 3, 2017, an agreement in the amount of \$64,200 was executed with SK Design Group, Inc for the scope of work that included designing a new trail segment from E 95th Street to Prospect Avenue along the Blue River. The scope included securing all necessary local, state, and federal permits. Amendments #1 and #2 add scope and fee in the amount of \$14,500 increasing the total contract amount to \$78,700 and agreement time until December 22, 2022.

Amendment #3 will add \$154,910 for construction inspection services and trail alignment preliminary design to the existing agreement for new agreement total of \$223,610. Amendment #3 would extend the contract time to December 22, 2024. Construction inspection is required by MoDOT for LPA (Local Project Agency) construction projects to fulfill the federal Highway grant requirements. The inspection services include daily construction inspection and documentation per LPA process.

This project is funded with PIAC funding from CD 5 for design and inspection in account 3090-708509-611040-70204916.

Recommendation

BACKGROUND

Mary Williams-Neal Community Center is located at 3801 E. Emmanuel Cleaver II Boulevard and was built in 1996. The center's 19,990 square feet provides community access to a gymnasium, locker rooms, a community meeting room, multipurpose room, art room, classroom, kitchen and outdoor swimming pool. The community will benefit from additions and improvements to the center in the coming years and the current aquatic space has room to expand its services to accommodate a larger number of youth to middle age groups.

On June 29, 2023, the Parks Department requested proposals from 7 vendors for the manufacturing and installation of a waterslide at the west end of the lap pool. On July 7, 2023 Mason Water Slides submitted the lowest, responsive and responsible bid in the amount of \$95,400. This project will require the manufacturing, shipping, installation, startup and staff training of a 77 foot long spiral tube slide to be located at the west end of the lap pool. The schedule for this project will be 90 calendar days from Notice to Proceed.

The Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity (CREO) Department approved the solicitation requirements as an informal bid. Seven vendors (4 SLBE and 3 Slide Manufacturers) were provided project information for bidding. Funding for this construction contract will come from two sources. \$88,800 from PIAC funded account number 3090-708309-611060-70240013 and \$6,600 from Deferred Maintenance account number 2030-707728-70400135.

SUBJECT: FY2024/25-2027-28 GO Bond Citywide Park Project List Priorities

BACKGROUND

The voters of Kansas City MO approved a General Obligation (GO) Bond Program question in November of 2022. The GO Bond question allocated \$80,000,000 for Parks related projects and will be spread out over five years. City Council introduced an ordinance that stated that \$60,000,000 will be allocated evenly between the six council districts for park projects in their districts. \$20,000,000 will be allocated for citywide Parks Department's projects.

On February 7, 2023, the Park Board approved a list to be submitted to City Budget Office and approved at the Finance Committee. Finance Committee approved year one funding for these project locations and scope: City's community centers assessment, Dr MLK Jr. Bridge design, Bruce R Watkins Connecting Park design, and SE Community Center pool reconstruction. \$5,250,000 was approved for improvements at these location.

The Parks staff has met with all the council districts in summer 2023 and presented a list of park projects to consider for their in-district GO Bond consideration. We sent revised project lists based on feedback at the in-person meeting to each of the council districts in early July. These projects lists have been sent to the City Budget office to add into this year's City budget process for approval.

The Citywide portion of the GO Bond program has a balance of \$14,750,000 to be allocated for years 2-5 of the bond program. We are recommending funding at these project locations: 9th, and Van Brunt Park, Blue Valley Park, Gage Park, Jarboe Park, Kessler Park, Marlborough Park, Dr MLK Jr. Bridge grant match, Bruce R Watkins connecting park grant match, Liberty Memorial grant match and Swope Park grant match. These projects total \$14,750,000.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the FY2024/25-2027-28 GO Bond Citywide Park Project List Priorities for citywide benefit projects and authorizes the Director or designee to work with Budget Office in the submittal process.

Establishing Fund No. 3823, the General Obligation Series Bond Series 2023A Q1-22 Projects Fund in the records of the City of Kansas City; estimating revenues in the amount of \$40,600,000.00 in Fund No. 3823, the General Obligation Series Bond Series 2023A Q1-22 Projects Fund and appropriating the same; designating requisitioning authorities; authorizing the Director of Finance to modify revenue estimates and appropriations as required and to close project accounts upon completion.

WHEREAS, the City of Kansas City, Missouri (the "City"), is authorized under the provisions of Article VI, Section 26 of the Constitution of Missouri, 1945, as amended, and its charter (the "General Obligation Bond Law") to incur indebtedness and issue and sell general obligation bonds of the City to evidence such indebtedness for lawful purposes, upon obtaining the approval of the required majority of the qualified electors of the City voting on the question to incur such indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Obligation Bond Law, a special election was also duly held in the City on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 (the "2022 Election"), on the question of whether to issue general obligation bonds of the City in an amount not to exceed \$125,000,000 for the purpose of paying for the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement, equipping, and furnishing of City parks, recreation, and entertainment facilities (the "Parks and Entertainment Facilities Question"); and

WHEREAS, the City has not previously issued any of the general obligation bonds authorized pursuant to the 2022 Election and now proposes to issue general obligation for the purpose of financing \$35,000,000 improvements to parks and entertainment facilities as so authorized at the 2022 Election by the approval of the Parks and Entertainment Facilities Question; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 220918, As Amended, the total amount to be issued for City Parks projects is \$5.25 million and these projects represent the Citywide allocation of projects and the required in-district allocations will be handled in future bond issuances; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Parks and Recreation has approved the \$5.25 million Citywide allocation; and

WHEREAS the cost of the projects will be funded with the issuance of general obligation bonds in Spring 2023 and scheduled debt service payments on the bonds will be made from ad valorum taxes over a successive twenty (20) year period with the first payments beginning in fiscal year 2024; NOW, THEREFORE,

AL-3823-129620-B, AL-3823-129631-B, AL-3823-129632-B and AL-3823-129686-B.

Section 7. That the City Council hereby declares its official intent to reimburse itself for certain expenditures made within sixty (60) days prior to or on and after the date of this Ordinance with respect to appropriations in Section 3 (the "Appropriation") with the proceeds of bonds expected to be issued by the City. The maximum principal amount of bonds expected to be issued for the Appropriation is not to exceed \$40,600,000.00. This constitutes a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 8. That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to modify the previously approved estimated revenues and appropriations in Section 3 as required to correctly record the budgetary amounts finalized through the sale of the Series 2023A Bonds into the marketplace.

Section 9. That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized to close project accounts, encumbrances and retainage related to the accounts in Section 3 and return the unspent portion to the fund balance from which it came upon the earliest of: (i) Project's completion; (ii) final maturity of financing, or (iii) five years after issuance.

I hereby certify that there is a balance, otherwise unencumbered, to the credit of the appropriation to which the foregoing expenditure is to be charged, and a cash balance, otherwise unencumbered, in the treasury, to the credit of the fund from which payment is to be made, each sufficient to meet the obligation hereby incurred.
